REFLECTION

Whoever loves me will keep my word, says the Lord . . .

Jesus tells the scribe today that the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and that the second is to love our neighbor as our self. Upon reading this gospel, we should be asking ourselves, "Is this how I love? Are these commandments the ones by which I am living my life?"

My brothers and sisters; all around us are forces at work to distract, delude, and deter us from experiencing God's plan and vision for us as individual believers and as the body of Christ as a whole. We see people shattered on the rocks of delusion and despair.
