#### THE FREEDOM OF GOD

Today's readings remind us that God is free: God acts as God wills regardless of what human beings might expect. In the reading from Numbers, God's spirit enters two men, Eldad and Medad, even though they had not been with the others who had received the spirit of God. And in Mark's Gospel, Jesus endorses an unknown exorcist, who did God's work in the name of Jesus but was not officially sanctioned by the disciples. That God's spirit is shared widely does not threaten Moses or Jesus. They celebrate the notion that God's spirit blows where it wills. Moses was shaping the people of Israel, and Jesus similarly was shaping the community of disciples, to encounter a radically free God who doesn't fit their preconceptions. This encounter, when received with humility, widens their vision and deepens their faith. God continues to shape the Church similarly today, to open us up to God's freedom.

#### LA LIBERTAD DE DIOS

Las lecturas de hoy nos recuerdan que Dios es libre: Dios actúa como quiere independientemente de lo que los seres humanos puedan esperar. En la lectura del libro de los Números, el espíritu de Dios entra en dos hombres, Eldad y Medad, aunque no habían estado con los otros que habían recibido el espíritu de Dios. Y en el Evangelio de Marcos, Jesús respalda a un exorcista desconocido, que hizo la labor de Dios en el nombre de Jesús, pero no fue autorizado oficialmente por los discípulos. Que el espíritu de Dios se comparta ampliamente no es una amenaza a Moisés ni a Jesús. Ellos celebran la idea de que el espíritu de Dios sopla donde quiere. Moisés estaba formando al pueblo de Israel, y Jesús de manera similar estaba formando a la comunidad de discípulos, para que se encontraran con un Dios radicalmente libre que no se ajusta a sus ideas preconcebidas. Este encuentro, cuando se recibe con humildad, amplía su visión y profundiza su fe. Dios sigue formando a la Iglesia de manera similar hoy, para abrirnos a la libertad de Dios.

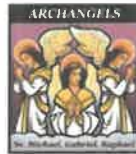

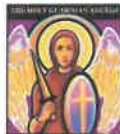

## What Do We Know About Angels?

For Catholics, angels are more than Christmas tree toppers. Belief in the supernatural appearances of heavenly figures is part of the fabric of our faith. But how much do we know about angels?

Depictions of angels as winged creatures are ubiquitous in art, and belief in them is found across the Abrahamic religious traditions. The Christian conception of angels derives from the Jewish characterization as pure spirit, created beings that are messengers of God (from Greek *angelos* "messenger") and were created before humanity.

Some have feast days, such as the three named archangels — Michael, Gabriel and Raphael — on Sept. 29; the feast of the guardian angels is celebrated Oct. 2. Churches, prayers and devotions are dedicated to these celestial beings.

## Where Do Angels Appear in Scripture?

**Angels appear throughout the Bible in both dreams and bodily form:** The Book of Revelation recounts a vision of seven angels with trumpets standing before God (cf. Rv 8:1-2). In the Old Testament, Jacob dreams of a ladder with angels ascending and descending (Gn 28:10-12).

**Angels are often sent for protection:** In the Book of Exodus, Moses receives an angel sent by God to guard him and lead him into the Promised Land (3:2, 23:20-22). An angel saves three young men — Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego — from being tortured by King Nebuchadnezzar in the third chapter of Daniel. And in perhaps the most famous account of Biblical angelic protection, after he was thrown into the lion's den, Daniel is saved by an angel who shuts the lions' mouths (Dn 6:19-22).

**Angels offer assistance:** An angel brought Elijah food, providing him sustenance for his meeting with the Lord on Mount Horeb (1 Kgs 19), and Joshua was restored as high priest by an angel in the third chapter of Zechariah.

**Angels in the New Testament:** The first chapter of the Gospel of Luke depicts the angel Gabriel appearing to Zechariah, the father of John the Baptist, to tell of Elizabeth's miraculous pregnancy, and later he speaks to Mary at the Annunciation, when he announces that she was to become the mother of the Lord. In the Gospel of Matthew, Joseph sees an angel of the Lord in his dreams three times: to make Mary his wife, to flee to Egypt and return to Nazareth. The Gospels chronicle appearances of angels throughout the life of Christ, starting with heralding His birth to shepherds: "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom His favor rests" (Lk 2:14). Later, angels minister to Him after He is tempted in the desert (Mt 4:11) and strengthen Him during His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane (Lk 22:43). Even after Jesus' passion, angels appear to two of Christ's closest disciples: Mary Magdalene sees two angels in white appear at the tomb (Jn 20:12-13), and an angel rescues Peter from imprisonment by King Herod as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles.

### Upcoming Legislation Could Force Taxpayers to Pay for Abortions

Two pieces of legislation currently in Congress could force American taxpayers to pay for abortions. The United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) has provided a website whereby persons can easily contact their legislators to voice their opposition to these initiatives. Go to [votervoice.net/USCCB/home](http://votervoice.net/USCCB/home) regarding:

**The Women's Health Protection Act**, which would impose abortion on demand at any stage of pregnancy. In addition, it would apply nationwide and force taxpayers to pay for abortions here and abroad.

Also, language which could possibly be inserted in **The Human Infrastructure Bill**, would force Americans to fund elective abortions.

**WHAT IS CUB SCOUTS?** Cub Scouts is a fun-filled program for boys and girls, grades K-5. Scouts go on amazing adventures while learning new skills, making friends, helping others, and building self-esteem.

**WHY SCOUTING?** Convenience - Families today are busier than ever, and with less free time! In Cub Scouts, all siblings (grade K-5) can participate in the same pack program. Scouting Builds Positive Character - Tufts University worked with Scouting over 3 years to measure character attributes of both Scouts and non-Scouts. In the beginning, there were no significant differences in character attributes. By the end, the differences were striking in several areas.

**HOW DOES IT WORK?** Your family will become part of a local group called a pack that meets once a month for adventures, activities, and recognition of achievements. The pack you choose is up to you. While there are likely many packs in your area, parents often decide to join the one closest to their child's school. Your Cub Scout will be a part of a smaller group, within the pack, based on grade and gender, that meets a few times each month for age-specific activities.

**HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?** There is an annual registration and insurance fee to join Scouting, which is prorated from the time you sign up through the end of the year. Please contact your local unit for more information. There are also one-time uniform costs and nominal activity fees that may be charged by your local group. These costs may be offset by fundraising and financial support for those who qualify.
